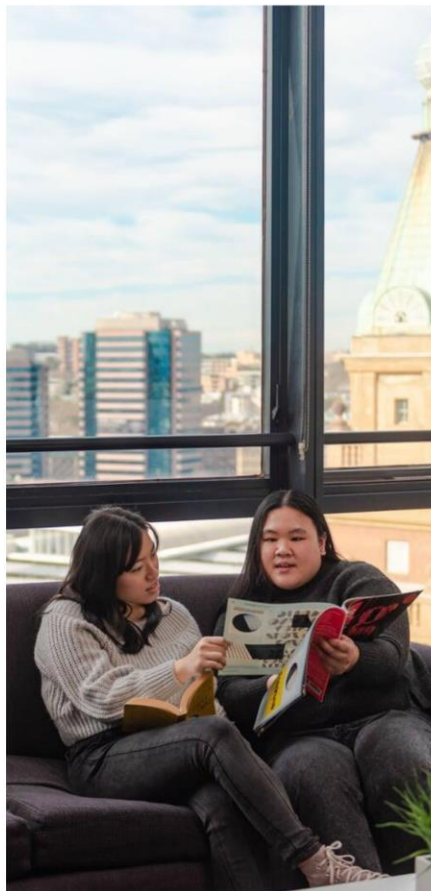

SAA PRESIDENT WELCOME

Another twelve months has flown by and the Student Accommodation Association continues to go from strength to strength.

The NPAS-accredited property portfolio has grown to 48 properties nationally, accounting for over 25,000 beds across the country. We currently have a 100% renewal rate among executive members who have chosen to renew their NPAS property accreditation for a new term.

Our non-executive membership increased during the 25/26 membership term as SAA's profile across the education ecosystem continues to grow. Non-executive membership offers participants in the education sector the opportunity to stay closely aligned with quality student accommodation providers and establish communication channels with our executive members.

There were some distinct changes to our approach to delivering our Industry Lunch program this term. With access to a larger NPAS-accredited property portfolio, the SAA National Committee was able to sit back and let members share their NPAS experience, enabling the sector to hear firsthand about the benefits of engaging with the process.

Our strategy was supported further by our investment in the creation of digital assets featuring members telling their stories, which have been utilised in social media campaigns.

Other investments this year include the introduction of a new website and the transfer to a sophisticated CRM platform which not only enhances member security but enables SAA HQ to communicate more effectively with members, sponsors, and to respond to general enquiries.

The SAA National Committee continues to encourage nominated representatives of SAA executive members to consider expressing interest in a position on the National Committee. If you like the work SAA is doing and want to be involved, I encourage you to express your interest through SAA HQ.

Now that the student accommodation sector and governments of all persuasions have embraced NPAS, the focus for the 26/27 membership term is to ensure Australian universities and other education providers across the country adopt the NPAS message and actively promote it to ensure students are able to make an informed accommodation choice.

Finally, I would like to express my gratitude to our members and sponsors for their continued support and acknowledge the tireless effort of the SAA National Committee, Olena (MemberBoat) and Karen (KBK Connection), who collaboratively deliver administrative and member/sponsorship services as SAA HQ. SAA MEMBER REPRESENTATION AND ACTIVITY 2025-26:

SAA TAKING PART IN THE 2026 NEAS CONFERENCE – MAY 2026

The Student Accommodation Association was pleased to take part in the 2026 NEAS Conference in Melbourne in May, contributing to important national discussions around student accommodation quality, standards and sector collaboration. SAA President **Geoff Denison** and National Committee Member **Prof. Kent Anderson** represented the Association across two panel sessions at the Melbourne Cricket Ground.

The first panel, *International Student Accommodation: Trends, Challenges and the Path Forward*, brought together sector leaders, including **Adam Kilburn** (CEO, NEAS) and **Nate Henderson** (Associate Director, Study NSW), to examine the current student accommodation landscape. The discussion explored the policy settings that have shaped the sector, alongside the opportunities and challenges influencing access, quality and future growth. SAA also presented *SAA Quality Through NPAS*, highlighting the role of the National Property Accreditation Scheme (NPAS) in supporting high standards across professionally managed student accommodation. As an industry-led program owned and administered by SAA, NPAS helps education stakeholders identify and promote accommodation providers committed to quality, safety and student wellbeing.

SAA's participation reinforced a clear message: access to quality student accommodation remains central to the international student experience, and sector-wide collaboration is key to ensuring strong outcomes for students and providers alike.

SAA MEMBERS STRENGTHEN INDUSTRY CONNECTIONS AT STUDYADELAIDE GLOBAL AGENT FAMIL – MARCH 2026

In March 2026, SAA members were invited to participate in the Access Adelaide Exhibition as part of StudyAdelaide's Global Agent Famil program, held at SkyCity Adelaide on 16 March.

The event brought together education agents from key source markets including China, India, Sri Lanka, the Philippines, and Vietnam, giving SAA members a direct opportunity to showcase their accommodation offerings to agents who play a significant role in guiding students' housing decisions.

SAA was pleased to extend this invitation to executive members on behalf of StudyAdelaide, and the event provided a valuable platform to build relationships with international agents, share information about their properties, and strengthen their presence in these markets.

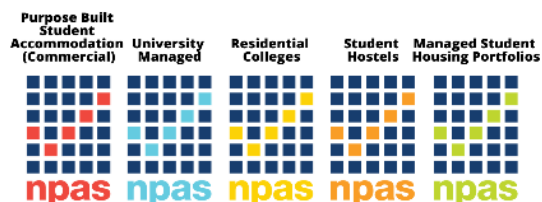

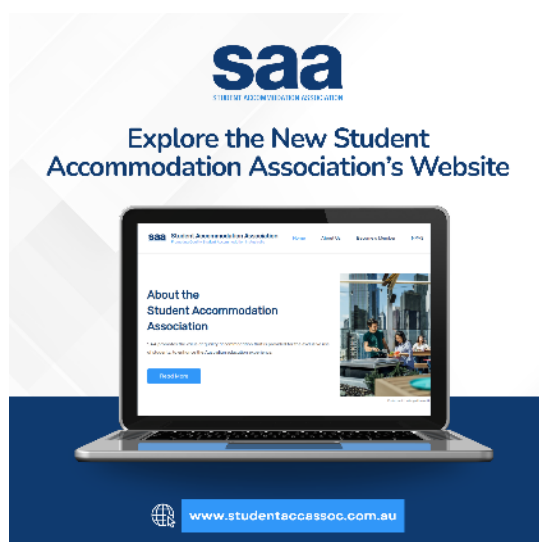


SAA OTHER UPDATES

NEW SAA WEBSITE

SAA launched a new website in November 2025, providing a more contemporary platform for connecting and informing Australia's purpose-built student accommodation community. The site brings together information for education providers, accommodation operators and government stakeholders, and continues to serve as a central resource for those engaged in the student accommodation sector.

SAA INDUSTRY LUNCH IN VICTORIA JUNE 2025

SAA held an industry lunch in Melbourne in June 2025, bringing together leaders from the student accommodation, education and government sectors. The event provided an important platform for collaboration and discussion around the shared goal of enhancing the international student experience through high-quality accommodation and support services.

Guests heard keynote presentations from **Tim Glass**, State Manager, Victoria at Scape Australia, who shared how NPAS accreditation has strengthened brand trust and enhanced the student experience. Scape's journey demonstrated how aligning with a national quality framework can deliver meaningful, long-term benefits for both students and accommodation providers.

Amanda Castray, Pro Vice-Chancellor Campus Life at the University of Tasmania, reflected on the vital role student accommodation plays in supporting student wellbeing, connection, and success. Her insights highlighted the importance of creating environments where students feel safe, supported, and part of a broader community.

The panel discussion, facilitated by **Robert Chasse**, Scape and SAA Committee Member, explored whether the broader education ecosystem fully recognises the value of the residential experience. Contributions from the speakers and SAA President **Geoff Denison** reinforced the idea that quality accommodation is far more than simply a place to live. It is a critical contributor to student belonging, engagement, and success.



SAA INDUSTRY EVENTS

SAA INDUSTRY LUNCH IN QUEENSLAND OCTOBER 2025

SAA National Committee held an Industry Lunch in Brisbane, with leaders from across Queensland's student accommodation, education and government sectors.

The event was expertly facilitated by SAA's National Committee member, **Tim Klitscher**, and featured three keynote presentations covering some of the most pressing issues facing the sector.

Alex Elibank Murray, Pro Vice Chancellor (Global and Engagement) at the University of the Sunshine Coast, spoke to the practical implications of the National Code reforms on Gender-Based Violence, exploring how universities are embedding the new requirements into campus life and what that means for student safety and wellbeing.

Toni Brownie, General Manager at Study Queensland, provided an inside look at Queensland's International Education and Training Strategy refresh, outlining the priorities shaping the state's approach to sustainable growth and what the changes mean for institutions, accommodation providers and industry partners.

Kevin Schefe, National Sales Manager at Allianz Partners, shared key findings from a national International Student Health Survey, offering valuable insights into the trends and challenges affecting student wellbeing across Australia.

A panel discussion facilitated by **Tim Klitscher** brought all three speakers together to explore how greater collaboration across government, education and accommodation can help deliver compliance, capacity and a better student experience.



SAA INDUSTRY EVENTS

SAA INDUSTRY LUNCH IN NEW SOUTH WALES APRIL 2026

SAA, in collaboration with the Event Sponsor Study NSW, held an Industry Lunch at NSW Parliament House in April, to explore how high standards in accommodation are shaping the international student experience in NSW.

The event also featured a free NPAS Information Session ahead of lunch, offering providers a practical introduction to the National Property Accreditation Scheme and how accredited accommodation supports student safety, experience and confidence in global markets.

Three keynote presentations set the scene for a rich afternoon of discussion. **Nate Henderson**, Associate Director at Study NSW, outlined the NSW Government's thinking on sustainable growth in student numbers and the role quality standards and regulatory settings play in balancing enrolment growth, student wellbeing and housing pressures across the state.

Iori Forsyth, Senior Associate at Study NSW, presented findings from the latest Student Sentiment Survey, with a focus on the role accommodation plays in shaping the international student experience. The survey confirmed that access to accommodation remains high on the priority list for international students considering NSW as a study destination.

Geoff Denison and **Rebecca Bendall** from SAA explored the implications of minimum standards in student accommodation, unpacking why they matter for student safety and wellbeing and what they mean for providers navigating an evolving regulatory landscape.

A panel discussion facilitated by **Prof Kent Anderson** brought together **Nate Henderson**, **Matthew Bowerman** (Housing Manager, University of Technology Sydney), **Weihong Liang** (President, International Students Representative Council Australia) and **Rebecca Bendall** to discuss how quality standards in student accommodation can enhance student experience and safety.

SAA INDUSTRY LUNCH IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA MAY 2026

SAA held an Industry Lunch in Adelaide at Crowne Plaza Adelaide, drawing leaders from across the student accommodation, education, and government sectors to consider the role quality accommodation plays in student wellbeing, city vibrancy and the long-term health of the sector.

Dominic Pangallo, Property Investment Advisor at the Adelaide Economic Development Agency, offered a city-level perspective on the role students play in shaping a connected, vibrant Adelaide, and why quality student accommodation is central to attracting talent and strengthening the city's position as a global education destination.

Prof Kent Anderson, SAA National Committee Member, spoke to the evolving policy and regulatory landscape shaping international education, including the expectations now placed on education providers and accommodation partners under the National Code reforms, and the role both play in supporting student success and sustainable sector growth.

Cam Bestwick, Director of Swick Learning, explored what the evidence tells us about building meaningful student communities, challenging providers to think beyond the physical offer and focus on the factors that genuinely drive student belonging, satisfaction, and retention.

A panel discussion facilitated by Robert Chasse brought these themes together, with **Denise von Wald FAICD**, **Dominic Pangallo**, **Cam Bestwick** and **Prof Kent Anderson** exploring the intersection of quality, community and growth in Adelaide's student accommodation sector.

WEBINAR: FUTURE-PROOFING STUDENT LIVING WITH STARREZ – DECEMBER 2025

SAA partnered with StarRez to deliver the webinar *Future-Proofing Student Living: 2025 Housing Trends Shaping APAC Accommodation Teams*, presented by SAA President **Geoff Denison** alongside **Victoria Londerholm**, Director of Content and Creative Marketing at StarRez. The webinar had 73 registrations and 40 live attendees.

The session explored the key forces shaping student accommodation across the APAC region, covering what students now expect around privacy, wellbeing and inclusivity, how accommodation teams are managing staffing pressures, the growing role of automation and digital tools in improving both student and staff experiences and emerging trends in off-campus housing and international student support.

The webinar continued SAA's ongoing partnership with StarRez and offered members and sector stakeholders practical, APAC-focused insights to help strengthen student outcomes and operational resilience heading into 2026.

WEBINAR: THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE STANDARD: SAFE, CONNECTED, SUPPORTED – MAY 2026

SAA hosted a webinar along with industry partners to explore what quality student living looks like in 2026 and the role technology, security and connectivity play in shaping the resident experience. The webinar had 78 registrations and 38 live attendees.

The session featured four speakers covering complementary aspects of the student accommodation experience. **James Cocovski** from StarRez walked through how smart use of data and student management systems can help accommodation teams build a clearer picture of residents, anticipate needs and improve satisfaction. **Jenna White** from Constant addressed the topic of safety, making the case that meaningful security goes beyond having systems in place and is fundamentally about how students feel in their environment day to day. **Eoin Ryan** from SiLANT covered connectivity, arguing that reliable internet infrastructure should be treated as essential rather than optional, and exploring how strong connectivity underpins academic performance, wellbeing and overall resident satisfaction.

Bringing the session together, **Prof Kent Anderson** from SAA outlined how NPAS connects these elements into a clear and credible standard for the sector, covering what the scheme looks for across operations, safety and infrastructure, why it matters to universities and partners, and how accreditation reflects a genuine commitment to quality and continuous improvement.

PARTNERSHIPS TO RAISE THE PROFILE OF SAA & NPAS

PUBLICATIONS: KOALA NEWS

SAA began a series of articles in partnership with Koala News, a publication that champions best practice in international education with a distinctly Australian voice and a proudly global outlook.

The first article in the series, *Raising the Bar: Why Student Accommodation Can't Be an Afterthought*, tackled a longstanding gap in the sector, the absence of a nationally consistent standard for defining and recognising quality student accommodation. The piece made the case that for international students, the experience of studying in Australia begins not in the lecture theatre but at the front door of their housing, and that NPAS provides the framework the sector has needed to bring clarity, consistency and confidence to accommodation decisions across the ecosystem.

The partnership with Koala News offers SAA a well-regarded platform to reach education agents, institutions and sector stakeholders with practical, advocacy-focused content that puts student outcomes at the centre.



VIDEO PRODUCTION: ONIX PRODUCTIONS

SAA has partnered with Onix Productions on a video content project that will support the association's communications and advocacy work well into the coming year.

Rather than a single production, the project is designed to build a structured library of video content captured at the SAA Industry Lunch at Parliament House NSW. With accommodation providers, university representatives, corporate sponsors and sector leaders gathered in one place, the event offered a rare opportunity to record meaningful industry perspectives that would otherwise take considerable time and effort to bring together.

Content captured at the event will be professionally produced and formatted for use across LinkedIn, newsletters, the SAA website, stakeholder communications, sponsor engagement and industry advocacy. The aim is for the material to continue supporting SAA's messaging for 12 to 18 months following production.

The project will also give SAA the opportunity to refresh existing video assets with new voices and updated perspectives, keeping the association's content current and representative of where the industry is today.

His background across operations, asset management, stakeholder relations and strategic growth has made him a strong addition to the Committee as SAA continues to advance sector-wide standards and advocacy.

And lastly, we welcomed **Eloise Gilbert** as a new Committee Member, who took the role of Treasurer. Eloise has worked with UniLodge for over 14 years, progressing from Front Office Reception roles to Regional General Manager. During this time, Eloise has worked across multiple states, teams and student accommodation operations, gaining broad experience in the sector. Eloise works collaboratively with all stakeholders and is focused on supporting and innovating with teams.
